INTAKE AND ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Intake: 1.January, 2.May, 3.September

Entry Requirements:

- Bachelor's Degree with a minimum CGPA of 2.50 or equivalent, as accepted by the Senate of Lincoln University College; or
- A Bachelor's Degree or equivalent which does not achieve a CGPA of 2.50 is acceptable provided the candidate has a minimum of 5 years working experience in the relevant field.

For postgraduate programs, prospective international students must pass the International English Language Testing System (IELTS) with a minimum score of 5.0; or equivalent qualifications.
